What are they?

▶ Winlink 2K

▶ A robust infrastructure that provides worldwide e-mail connectivity via amateur radio, the internet, or a combination of both

Winlink Express

► Client software that runs on a Windows 7 or above computer that is used to access the Winlink 2K environment


Why Do I Care?

- Winlink has been adopted as their digital messaging system by virtually every emergency response organization in the country including DHS, FEMA, Washington State, GSEM, Red Cross, etc.
- Winlink uses standard digital modes available to all amateur radio operators
- The Winlink infrastructure is robust, has widespread coverage, and is easy to access
- Large number of resources available to support user learning and operation






Local Infrastructure is Robust

Important Features in Winlink Express

- Access to and automated use of ICS Forms, Radiograms, and more
- Relatively simple configuration with most common TNCs.
- Supports VHF/UHF and HF modes
 - ▶ 1200 and 9600 Packet on VHF/UHF
 - ► HF
 - ▶ Winmor 500 and Winmor 1600 TNC built in
 - ► Pactor (I, II, III, and IV)
 - ▶ ARDOP when available
- Attachments, delivery confirmation, tactical callsigns, group addressing, etc., etc.,.....
